I greatly appreciated your letter of August 4 giving me so much information that is helpful concerning the background and formation of your "Life Origins Foundation." You have answered my questions so fully. This I appreciate. I am especially glad to get word concerning the backgrounds and attitudes of the various men. I note that you did omit certain men from your group and I presume there is good reason for this.

I am sending you a copy of Movement of Destiny. I hope most sincerely that you will read this carefully, for I believe this will give you a background of denominational relationships and attitudes that will be a very definite help to you in your present problem. I do not, of course, deal with that in Movement of Destiny but with the diverted views over the nature of Christ, and the Godhead, and the Holy Spirit, and the relation of the Atonement to the Cross, that has had to be rectified before we were to be prepared to go before the world.
